Albany Law School Christian Law Society By-Laws 2011-2012

Albany Law School Christian Law Society is a validly chartered SBA group.

A student at Albany Law School becomes a member of Albany Law School Christian Law Society by attending one club meeting and requesting their name to be added to the membership list.

A student will remain an active member by attending two Albany Law School Christian Law Society events per semester. This includes club meetings, fundraising initiatives, and school events sponsored by the Albany Law School Christian Law Society.

The Christian Law Society of Albany Law School will hold meetings once every month during each school semester.

The office of President, Vice President and Treasurer will be elected from the Albany Law School Christian Law Society's active members during the Spring semester. These elections will be open to active members of the Albany Law School Christian Law Society only. An inactive member may petition for the right to run and/or vote in an election on a case-by-case basis, to be reviewed by the current executive board members.

In order to win, the candidate must secure a simple majority number of votes.

This new executive board is considered valid unless an active-member student protests the election (*OR*) An officer of the executive board may be impeached for failing to perform their duties. The protesting member must submit a written petition to the standing executive board with the basis of their petition clearly outlined and the petition must be signed by one other protesting member in support of the petition (*OR*) The appointed member must submit a written report explaining the circumstances surrounding their failure to perform their duties. Any petition submitted will first be reviewed by the executive board and then voted on by the entire active membership of the club.

If an officer is impeached an election is held to fill the vacancy as soon as possible.

The new leadership takes over at the start of the Fall semester.
